Staff's Recommended Action:

Motion to be approved by consent:

"The PAC recommends the HCAOG Board approve Resolution 19-11 adopting the TDA 2% Pedestrian and Bicycle allocations to the Cities of Arcata, Blue Lake, and Trinidad."

Staff Summary:

As stated in HCAOG's TDA Rules, HCAOG shall distribute the annual allocation of the 2% Pedestrian and Bicycle TDA fund in a 50:50 split, as follows: 50% is to be reserved until a \$500,000 target is reached, or reserve is used for an urgent regional priority; and 50% is to be available for projects proposed by member entities.

This year, the TDA 2% Pedestrian and Bicycle fund amounted to approximately \$105,000. With the most recent allocation, the reserve account's balance is \$261,826.74. A total of \$52,829 is available for project solicitation.

Three cities and HCAOG responded to the solicitation for available TDA 2% Pedestrian and Bicycle funds. The TAC voted to recommend funding the three city projects, and not fund HCAOG's proposed competitive, countywide program for artistic bike racks. TAC members noted that the bike rack program would be better initiated by individual jurisdictions rather than the regional agency.

The funding requests and the TAC's recommended allocations are shown below.
